Construction and Infrastructure WDC represents a diverse range of 57 industries that are grouped into 11 strategic sectors.






## What do WDCs do?

Workforce Development Councils (WDCs) are industry-led bodies re-shaping vocational education across Aotearoa New Zealand.

We will bring consistency to industry standards and learning outcomes - making sure they are applied across the country, and across all modes of learning. This means learners will attain the right skills and employers will have access to the right people.

We look after the development, maintenance and review of standards, micro-credentials and qualifications in the construction and infrastructure industries.

 Identify industry skill needs & advocate for them to be met now and in the future



## ESI Sector – some of what we are hearing....

New Zealand's electricity industry workforce is estimated to include at least 8,000 people split between: Transmission, Distribution, Generation companies, and Contract service providers

Thousands more highly skilled people are required by 2035 to meet the growth.

We need to take a collaborative approach to enable the sector to meet the growing energy needs of New Zealand and the commitment of decarbonisation
