

What happened ?					

Our contract partner was working on a third party's site, installing palisade fencing around a secondary substation. At the time of the incident, the IP had been taking pictures of the post excavation(s) when they tripped on the spoil and hurt their wrist.

Although the IP initially felt pain at the time of the fall, they didn't think they were injured. This was not reported into SSEN-D's 30 Minute Reporting Line.

The IP applied a support and continued working as normal until medical attention was sought 3 days from the event. IP was advised that they had fractured their wrist.

As the incident is investigated, we would remind our employees and contract partners that <u>all SHE Incidents</u> experienced when working on behalf of SSEN-D shall be reported to the 30 Minute Reporting Line without delay.



Key initial learnings to be shared more widely

What happened

Our contract partner was working on a third party's site, installing palisade fencing around a secondary substation. At the time of the incident, the IP had been taking pictures of the post excavation(s) when they tripped on the spoil and hurt their wrist. A few days later, IP was diagnosed with a broken wrist.

What we found

- Spoil identified in the Stage 1 risk assessment as a hazard but not included in the POWRA and suitable controls not put in place to manage the risk effectively.
- This was a routine task, carried out on numerous occasions by the individual without event. A lapse in concentration (whilst focusing on the task in hand) has prevented the IP from recognising the trip hazard at the time.
- Contract partner failed to report via the 30-minute line that their employee fell whilst working for SSEN-D. An opportunity was potentially missed to prevent the injury being exasperated.

What we did

- · Contract partner has been reminded of the importance of immediate reporting.
- Contract partner has undertaken a tool-box talk and coaching conversation with their team.
- Third party site have confirmed that all persons requiring access via their premise will undertake site induction which includes additional reminder on reporting incidents in a timely manner.
