Introduction

A difficult test, especially as these two pictures are exactly the same! Jumping into a vehicle is something most of us do every day, but how do you know if anything has changed since you last drove the vehicle? Usually a quick glance will tell you if there's a flat tyre or a dent to the bumper, but what if the engine is low on oil or water, or one of the headlights isn't working?

One of the requirements of driving at work is to carry out a daily vehicle check, specifically designed to help you check the significant points, make sure that the vehicle is roadworthy and legal to drive, and contribute to you reaching your destination and returning home safely.

What action is required?

Whether you use a paper logbook or an electronic tablet to carry out and record your checks, you should make sure that a daily check is completed, even if the vehicle has been used by someone else during the day.

If you find an issue or defect with the vehicle or trailer, report it to the maintenance provider and make sure that the defect is rectified or repaired before using it.
