This bulletin has been re-issued following recent link box audits, where the protection blankets were found to be incorrectly fitted or of an incorrect size.

It is essential that appropriate size blankets are correctly fitted to ensure they provide the required mitigation.

The following shows a protection blanket incorrectly fitted. The protection blanket is too small for the size of the chamber, preventing it from working as intended. The photograph was taken when the blanket was fitted in 2017 by the craftsman who installed it.



This resulted in the fire igniting the adjacent car/s when the link box faulted







Protection blankets must be the correct size & fitted correctly

The following gives guidance on how a protection blanket shall be fitted:

The protection blanket must be fitted neatly around the bell cover with particular attention being given to tucking it in around the edges. This is necessary to give maximum benefit in the event of a failure, as shown in the following four examples.

1. Lay the correct sized protection blanket over the link box pit with the label & strap facing up.



2. Push down on the label until it sits centrally over the bell cover.







3. Tuck the protection blanket down on all four sides of the bell cover using a suitable blunt insulated tool such as a Female link extractor.
