
Introduction:

Following the recent tragic news from two different UK Network Operators reporting two separate fatal injury incidents involving contact with electricity, we have recognised a number of similar near-miss and injury incidents in SSEN, with two of our colleagues requiring hospital treatment following an incident last week.

While the details from last week's Low Voltage incident are still being investigated, there are similar trends that we can use to remind ourselves of the minimum requirements when completing routine tasks as part of our normal work activity:

Reminder:

Work on the electricity network is inherently hazardous and therefore robustly controlled to minimise the risk to persons involved. The mitigation of the risks is primarily achieved by the strict implementation and compliance with our Operational Safety Rules and associated Approved Procedures.

All SSEN managers must ensure this communication is shared with their employees and contract partners.
